Jesus Meets Us Where We Are At

Dear Friends:

I hope you are experiencing the special graces of the Easter Season. I am on the airplane traveling to California to spend some time with my family. As I watched "The Greatest Showman," I was moved to tears at the end when Barnum recognized that he had been going in the wrong direction. He was "trying to be more than he was." In that striving, he lost his way and almost lost his true self, family, and particular calling. It was only through losing everything he had worked so hard to gain that he could appreciate what was really important and reclaim his authentic self.

This story reminds me of the disciples on the road to Emmaus. They had lost everything that they had hoped for with the passion and death of Jesus. He was not the worldly king that they had thought. Deflated and defeated, they were walking away from Jerusalem, away from God's promises and their dreams.

Jesus meets his disciples on the road to Emmaus. As they journey, Jesus first lets them share about all the trouble and sorrow that filled their hearts—He meets them where they are at—but He does not leave them there. He then breaks open the Word of God by describing the prophesies that indicate how the Messiah would have to suffer and die. He, the Word of God, breaks through their dismay and prepares them to encounter Him in the breaking of the Bread.

Jesus wants to meet us in the midst of our dismay. He is willing "to stay with us," even when we have walked in the wrong direction. He desires to give us His True Presence, strengthening for the journey back to the New Jerusalem—toward our true eternal home. When we invite Jesus to stay with us, His Presence enables us to become the fullness of the person He made us to be. Please know my love and prayers are with you!



Sacred Heart Center of Hope Makes Progress with Renovation



On the Solemnity of the Annunciation, April 9, 2018, we began renovating the building that the Diocese of Steubenville purchased to become Sacred Heart Center of Hope. To celebrate this milestone, we had a prayer service to give God thanks and to pray for the renovations, safety of the workers, and fundraising efforts.

We also read from Luke's Gospel on the healing of the woman with a hemorrhage and Jairus' daughter, and Sr. Katherine Caldwell gave a short sharing about the mission of the Sacred Heart Center and how Jesus is the one who heals. The Center will have a kitchen, and a large multipurpose and two offices in the basement. On the top floor, there will be a Chapel, a prayer ministry room, receptionist area, administrative office, and several counseling and group rooms. We hope to have the renovations completed by fall.
